
Rewards


Teachers will give you stickers and certificates if you try your best in lessons and are kind to others.





Each week, you have to count how many rules you kept all week and record it in your Passport to Success.





Every rule that you follow all week earns you a point on your Passport to Success. If you follow all of the rules, you win a prize on Friday. At the end of term, you can win big prizes just by following the rules!

The Traffic Light System

Every teacher uses the traffic light system. Look out for them around school.



The gold star: if your behaviour is excellent, your teacher will move your name up here!



The green light: everybody's name starts here each day. It's good to be green!


The orange light: if you stop following a rule, you will have to miss 1 minute of breaktime to reflect on your behaviour.

The red light: if you continue to stop following the rules, you will have to miss 2 minutes of you breaktime to reflect on your behaviour.

The Card System

Most behaviour is managed using the traffic lights.

If behaviour is more serious, teachers will use the card system.




Yellow Card Behaviours

Continual poor behaviour despite using the traffic lights
Repeatedly calling out
Constant disturbance to others
Name calling
Refusing to follow instructions
Bad language

5 minutes of breaktime to reflect on behaviour.

Miss Sabharwal will work with vou.




Orange Card Behaviours

Leaving the classroom without adult's permission Intimidating behaviour
Argumentative behaviour
Already had a yellow card that day

10 minutes of breaktime to reflect on behaviour.

Red Card Behaviours

Physical behaviour: hurting others
Placing themselves or others in danger
Bullying (see anti-bullying policy for definition and identification of bullying behaviours)

Disrespecting another's race, religion, gender or another part of their identity

Miss Ridge may place you on report.
